Yesterday, Thursday 11 November 2021

- The CapED Ministerial Breakfast Meeting took place yesterday, bringing together donors and Education Ministers and representatives from CapED beneficiary countries, including 11 ministers. It was the first time CapED countries and donors were sitting around the same table since the outbreak of COVID-19. The meeting was therefore an opportunity for participants to discuss the education crisis caused by the pandemic, to share common challenges and good practices, as well as to make known their capacity development needs going forward.
- The event Healthy & educated: the double dividend of investing in health and well-being through education was well attended by UNESCO Members States' permanent delegations, showing great interest from many countries on the topics of health and education, comprehensive sexuality education and safe and inclusive learning environments. The event included a mix of pre-recorded messages and live presentations from government representatives, young advocates and teachers.
